We add -ing to most verbs:

stand – stand**ing** 

hold - hold**ing** 

For verbs ending in -e, we drop the e and add -ing:

use - using come - coming

Other verbs:

swim – swi**mm**ing

run – ru**nn**ing

shop - shopping

sit – si**tt**ing
